WHO WE ARE

Nature Canada connects the dots between local action and systemic change. For more than 80 years, we have been Canada's voice for nature. We work to ensure that solving the biodiversity crisis is a government priority. We advocate on behalf of other species for habitat protection and good policy. We facilitate mobilization among our extensive network of partners and individual nature-lovers to achieve our shared goals and generate the political will for needed transformation.

Nature Canada is committed to equity and anti-racism and acknowledges that achieving racial justice and gender equality is an ethical imperative. Our goal is to take an intersectional approach which considers how power is exercised across issues of gender, age, class, ability, and culture, as well as race.

WHAT WE DO

Nature Canada has a wide suite of programs, including but not limited to:

Protected Areas - Our protected areas work is accomplished through policy campaigns centred around the federal protected areas targets of protecting 30% of land, waters and oceans by 2030. We work closely with our provincial partners and other environmental non-governmental organizations (eNGOs) as well as regularly engaging our Nature Nation to advocate for the importance of protecting Canadian lands and oceans.

Nature Based Climate Solutions (NBCS) - For the first time in history, the Government of Canada has committed to making major investments in, and prioritizing, nature-based solutions to climate change. This includes a commitment to: put in place conservation,



mitigation and restoration measures in forests, grasslands, agricultural lands, wetlands and coastal areas. This builds on major commitments to expand protected areas and advance Indigenous-led conservation, which are also crucial components of a NBCS agenda.

2 Billion trees - A centre-piece of the commitment to nature-based climate solutions is the federal commitment to plant two billion net additional trees and initiate regional and urban forest plans. Nature Canada wants to ensure the government 1) Ensures the right trees are planted, in the right places, for the right reasons. 2) Makes a long-term commitment to monitoring and documenting results for climate change and biodiversity. 3) Commits to consultations with stakeholders and Indigenous nations to achieve multiple program benefits and avoid unintended negative consequences.

Saving Bird Lives - Nature Canada's bird conservation work addresses human-related causes of bird mortality and focuses on the species groups that are in the most trouble including aerial insectivores, shorebirds and grassland birds. We have campaigns to keep cats inside, certify cities as bird-friendly, preserve swallow roosts, and conduct bird surveys on the James Bay.

Organizing - Our organizing team works to support the Nature Network, a group of almost 900 nature organizations across the country ranging from birding clubs, to trail associations and provincial affiliates. We provide resources and training to help build organizational capacity through a model called Engagement Organizing, as well as engaging them in advocacy campaigns to protect the nature we all love.

Communications - There is power in mobilizing hundreds and thousands of Canadians behind nature initiatives. We have developed a large list of nature-defenders and are always working to add more to that list. We then provide easy to access ways to make their voices heard.
