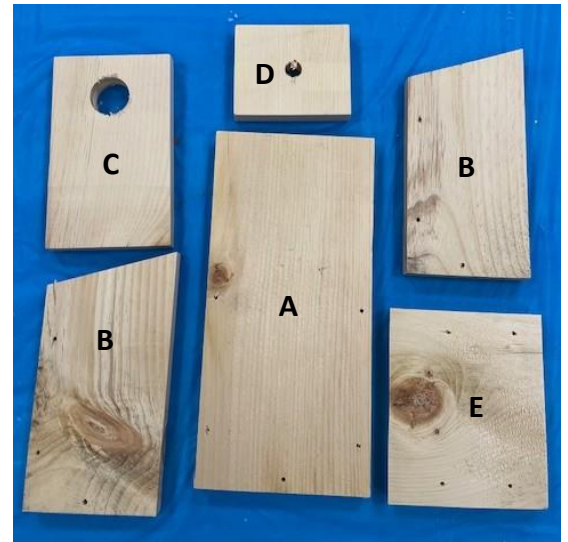
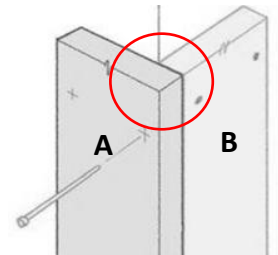


NESTING BOX ASSEMBLY

1. Check—you should have 6 wooden pieces, 12 wood screws (1 1/4" or 1 1/2", 3 cm or 4cm), 1 L-shaped screw hook, and a Robertson red #2 screwdriver.
2. Find the largest board (A). It has five holes. (Forget the one in the middle at the bottom for now.) This is the back of your nest box.
3. Using your fingers, put 4 screws in the 4 holes along the sides, only far enough to feel the tips.



4. Find the two identical boards with an angled edge (B). These are the walls. Attach the walls with the longest edge against the back (A) and the angled edge to the top. Keep the bottom edges aligned and the wall piece aligned with the edge of the back (A). Drive in the 4 screws and tighten to draw the boards together.



5. Put in the front door (C) using **only the 2 screws at the top**. Set this piece so that the bottom edge is 1 cm longer or below the bottom edge of the walls. Using only 2 screws and leaving a space at the top allows the door (C) to swing out for cleaning. Check that your door (C) swings out.
6. Attach the floor (D). It is rectangular and fits one way only. Use 3 screws, 1 at the bottom of each wall (B) and 1 at the bottom of the back (A). The front door (C) is not attached to the floor so it can open for cleaning.
7. Attach the roof (E) using 4 screws. Place the beveled (angled) edge against the back (A).
8. Put in the “door key”, L-shaped screw hook, through one of the unused holes on either of the walls (B). Turn in just far enough to keep the door (C) from swinging out.
9. Congratulations! Your nesting box is now complete and ready for its bluebird occupants.
10. Hang your nest box outdoors, preferably south east facing and about 2 meters high.
